# **Pre-Designed Garden Kits**

These pre-designed garden kits are designed to take the guesswork out of choosing plants suitable for your yard. Four expertly created kits are available, suitable for a wide range of habitat types. Each kit contains 36 plants consisting of 6 species or 72 plants consisting of 12 species.

## **Shady Garden Kit** (36 plants/6 species)

Shade to partial shade. If you have more shade than sun, then this is the kit for you. Designed with species that can take a higher amount of shade while still providing great benefits to native wildlife. Many species will also grow in sunnier conditions as well.

- Columbine (*Aquilegia canadensis*)
- Anise Hyssop (*Agastache foeniculum*)
- Long-beaked Sedge (*Carex sprengei*)
- Jacob's Ladder (*Polemonium reptans*)
- Zig Zag Goldenrod (*Solidago flexicaulis*)
- Calico Aster (*Symphyotrichum lateriflorum*)

## **Monarch Special Garden Kit** (36 plants/6 species)

Full to partial sun. Designed to support Monarchs from the caterpillar stage through migration, this kit is sure to be a Monarch magnet!

- Swamp Milkweed (*Asclepias incarnata*)
- Showy Milkweed (*Asclepias speciosa*)
- Butterfly Weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*)
- Whorled Milkweed (*Asclepias verticillata*)
- Meadow Blazing Star (*Liatris ligulistylis*)
- Showy Goldenrod (*Solidago speciosa*)

## **Short & Tidy Garden Kit** (36 plants/6 species)

Full to partial sun. Contains a mix of wildflowers that stay relatively compact and are not prone to spreading. Perfect for a small garden space or when looking for a more traditional garden look.

- Butterfly Weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*)
- Prairie Coreopsis (*Coreopsis palmata*)
- Lance Leaf Coreopsis (*Coreopsis lanceolata*)
- White Prairie Clover (*Dalea candida*)
- Narrow-leaved Coneflower (*Echinacea angustifolia*)
- Prairie Phlox (*Phlox pilosa*)

## **Rusty Patched Bumblebee Garden Kit** (72 plants/12 species)

Full to partial sun. This kit was designed to create habitat particularly suited for the endangered Rusty Patched Bumblebee, this full garden kit will also support a wide variety of other pollinators.

- Butterfly Weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*)
- Purple Prairie Clover (*Dalea purpurea*)
- Narrow Leaved Coneflower (*Echinacea angustifolia*)
- Prairie Smoke (*Geum triflorum*)
- Meadow Blazing Star (*Liatris ligulistylis*)
- Wild Lupine (*Lupinus perennis*)
- Slender Penstemon (*Penstemon gracilis*)
- Little Bluestem (*Schizachyrium scoparium*)
- Upland Goldenrod (*Solidago ptarmicoides*)
- Stiff Goldenrod (*Solidago rigida*)
- Prairie Dropseed (*Sporobolus heterolepis*)
- Sky Blue Aster (*Symphyotrichum oolentangense*)

**WHY NATIVE MINNESOTA PLANTS?**

Native plants were here long before lawnmowers, sprinklers and garden chemicals. Once established, plants native to this region are low maintenance and do not require care typically associated with gardens. Native perennials build a strong, deep root system before focusing on the production of leaves, stems and flowers, resulting in plants that are sturdy and drought tolerant. Native plants are beautiful, and are uniquely able to provide food and shelter for wildlife including butterflies, dragonflies, pollinators and birds.

**MATCHING SPECIES TO LOCATIONS**

It is important to match species requirements with site features such as soil type, light conditions, moisture and drainage for the planting to be successful. Mesic (medium) soil types drain well but contain moisture all or most of the time. Clay soils will hold higher moisture levels and sandy soils are often drier as they will drain faster. Some plants are more sensitive to conditions such as moisture and light, so it is best to match your conditions with those described for each plant or flat in the order form.

**SITE PREPARATION**

You can start now! Proper site preparation gives your plants a great head start. Removal of competitive weeds and grasses must be accomplished before planting begins. One option: cover the area with 4-6 layers of newspaper or cardboard to block out sunlight. Saturate the newspaper or cardboard with water to prevent it from blowing away, then apply clean shredded mulch. A few weeks later, after the newspaper or cardboard has softened, punch holes in it and insert your new plants.

**ABOUT WILD ONES**
